PEOPLE We are all touched.

DR. RAJWANT SINGH This is an American issue—as Americans we must stop the violence. Our forefathers did not intend to permit guns—such as AK-47s and Glocks—in schools, temples, churches, and movie theatres.

PEOPLE No more mass killings!

THE REV. DONALD ISAAC In the District of Columbia, in Prince George's County, in Baltimore—we have lost too many young lives, too many lives. The growing list sadly represents too many families destroyed, children without a parent, and teenagers planning their own funerals.

PEOPLE We WILL do better than this!

SENATOR RICHARD BLUMENTHAL Newtown woke us up to the tragedy of gun violence. And Aurora, Lafayette, Chattanoga, the Navy Yard, and Charleston live in our memories—yet the killing goes on.

PEOPLE How many more?

DR. LARRY GOLEMON This national shame does not take a holiday. This human family, all God's children, must stand together against the gun manufacturers and those who promote irresponsible use of guns.

PEOPLE Now is the time!

SENATOR CHRISTOPHER MURPHY Let us commit to working TOGETHER, one unified movement to stop the killing and raise up a new life for our children and grandchildren. Newtown, Chicago, Ferguson, Oak Creek, and Roseburg—small towns and big cities across the country—demand this.

PEOPLE We WILL demand a plan! Now is the time! Enough!
